Springfield man gets 10 years for cocaine, gun

A 19-year-old Springfield man has been sentenced to more than 10 years in federal prison for having crack cocaine and a gun in his vehicle.

Latravian Medley pleaded guilty Oct. 25 in U.S. District Court to possession with the intent to deliver 28 grams or more of crack cocaine and with possessing a firearm in furtherance of a drug crime.

He was sentenced Friday to 10 years, 10 months in prison by Senior U.S. Judge Richard Mills. Medley was sentenced to 70 months for the drug crime and a consecutive term of 60 months for having the gun.

Springfield attorney Mark Wykoff, who represented Medley, said the government successfully moved to have considered in sentencing an incident in the Pike County Jail in which Medley was found in possession of a homemade weapon.
